



Fiery JDF FAQ

What is Fiery JDF?

Fiery® JDF is a standard feature for newer Fiery print controllers shipped with Fiery System 9 release 2 or later, and available as an update for some Fiery controllers at no extra cost. It is a scalable solution that connects your Fiery controller and to JDF-enabled workflows.

The Fiery JDF feature set is not available for all Fiery print controllers. To see if Fiery JDF can be enabled or installed on your Fiery print controller, visit our [JDF Supported Printers Page](#). What is JDF?

JDF is an open standard technology that allows data to pass between different applications and systems to help automate print production workflow. It simplifies data exchange and collection, eliminates manual data entry and re-entry and makes print production faster, more efficient and accurate. JDF specifies how a job should be managed and produced from customer concept to final production.

What is the difference between Fiery JDF and Fiery JDF connector?

Fiery JDF is a feature set that integrates into your Fiery print controllers. JDF jobs and attributes can be managed using Fiery Command WorkStation® 5.1 or newer. The Fiery JDF Connector requires an extra workstation to enable JDF technology for your Fiery print controllers, and the JDF settings have to be managed by Fiery JDF Connector user interface.

Does Fiery JDF integrate with other vendors' products?

Yes. With over 30 third-party JDF development partners, we continue to add Fiery JDF certified partner products to our Fiery JDF integration. Currently validated JDF-enabled products include EFI™ Print MIS, EFI Digital StoreFront®, Adobe® Acrobat® Professional and Canon imageWARE Prepress Manager, Agfa Apogee prepress system, Kodak Prinergy Workflow and more.

Does the Fiery JDF Update work with all Fiery versions?

How do I install Fiery JDF for on my Fiery controllers?

Fiery JDF may already be available on your Fiery print controller, If Fiery JDF is not already available on your Fiery print controller, you may be able to install the service. Check the [JDF Supported Printers Page](#) to see if your printer is supported for Fiery JDF updates. If you find your Fiery Print controller listed as “Update Available”, please contact your supplier to install Fiery JDF update for your system. What information is sent from the EFI Print MIS to the Fiery controller and from the Fiery controller to the EFI Print MIS?

Information that is exchanged between solutions is dependent on the data's creator. When a JDF job ticket is initially created in an MIS, the MIS sends it to the Fiery controller through Fiery JDF as much job detail as can be defined. This information includes job numbers, job IDs, job descriptions, media and quantities. When a job is manufactured through the Fiery, the Fiery JDF returns status and costing information to the MIS.

How do I configure and use Fiery JDF on my Fiery print controller?

The guide describes how to configure Fiery JDF set-up on Fiery Command WorkStation 5, how to configure JDF – submitting applications such as Web-to-print (e.g. EFI Digital StoreFront), MIS (e.g., EFI PrintSmith™), make-ready systems (e.g., Canon imageWARE Prepress Manager) and customer intent creators (e.g., Adobe Acrobat) and how to set-up media workflow for Web-to-print, print MIS and Fiery-driven® printers.
